Nirmala Memorial Foundation College of Education Kandivali adheres to Academic Calender on regular basis for the conduct of Internal Examination. The college being a training college consists of approximately 200 students of F.Y. and S.Y. batch each academic year. The whole B.Ed. Programme is distributed into 4 semesters, of two semesters in each academic year.

There are three main Courses in each semester for which Class Tests and Essay Tests have to be conducted. Hence in Total in each semester there are 3 Class Tests and 3 Essay Tests. The college **provides Notices** to the students in advance for **Essay Test**, along with 3 Essay Test Questions prepared in advance and shared with the students. After completion of one Unit 1 or any other Unit chosen for the Essay Test, followed by the completion of the portion of Essay Test, Semester end Essay test is conducted.

Similarly, Class Test dates are also given in advance as per the Academic Calendar, corresponding to the dates, in advance all the Three Units are duly discussed and portion completed. Learning Resources, study materials related to the contents are also shared for the same.

Question Bank is prepared and University Question Papers of corresponding Units are also provided to the students for preparation from all perspectives. The students are even asked to write answers to a few questions and get them checked by the teachers before the Examination.

Feedback sessions after each Test and correction of the papers is carried out. The students are guided as per the corrections and modifications required for writing answers in each paper. The best answer copy is maintained in the Library for the students to refer to. Pdf of the same is shared with the students too.

Clarity as per the type of answer expected at the University Level Examination is provided, along with the pattern of writing Questions of various types.

1. Community Service at Assesi bhavan Old age home: Date: 17th August 2017

Community work is voluntary service provided by anyone to people who are less privileged or fortunate. Nirmala Memorial Foundation college of Education at Kandivali, engages the interns in community service, to become active members of their community and thus have a lasting, positive impact on society at large. sessions couldn't be considered as the student can take help from parents or online sources.


